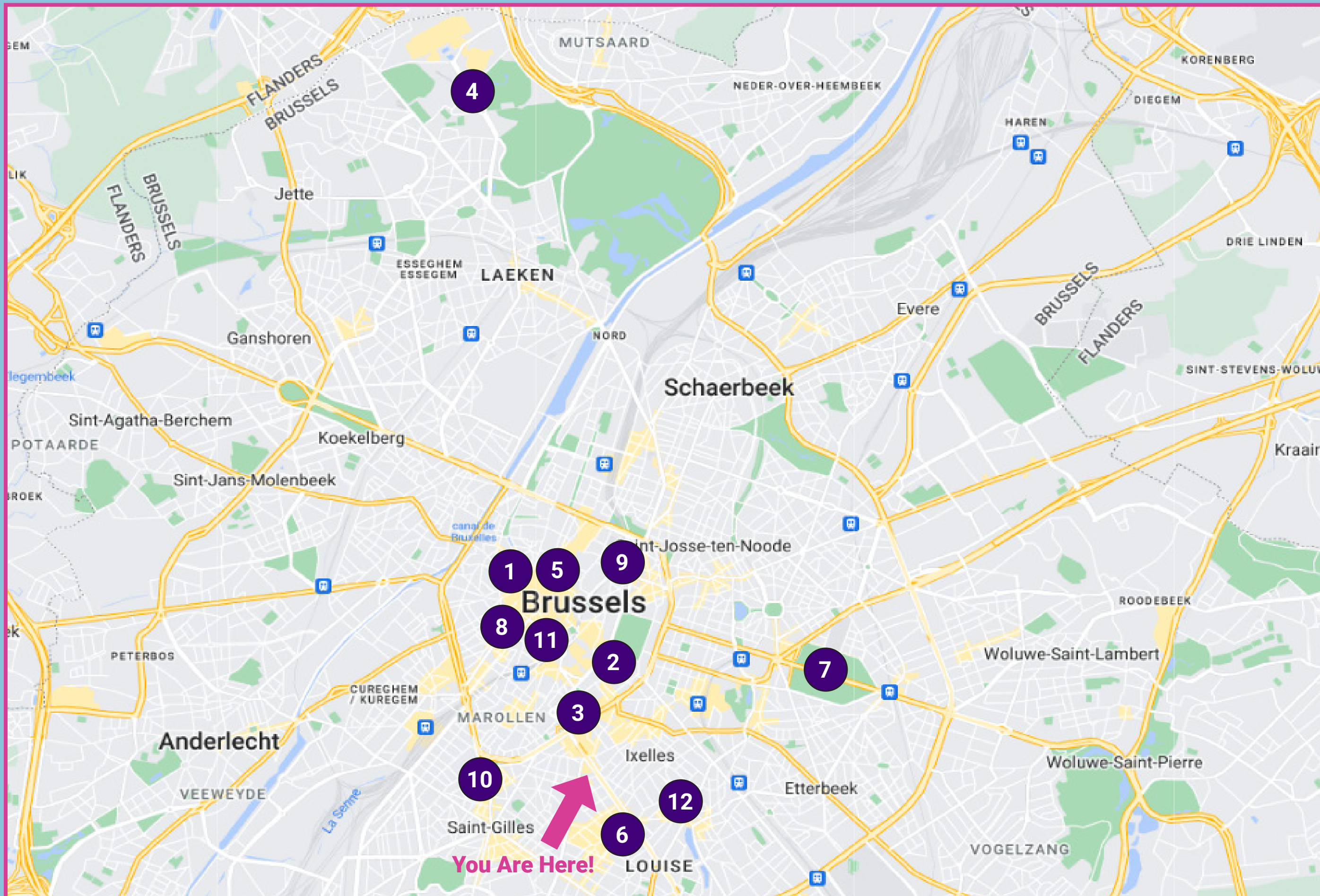

SIGHTS & LANDMARKS

1. Grand Place *Free*

Considered one of the most beautiful medieval squares in Europe, the ornate Grand Place is the center of Brussels where many historic buildings dating from the 17th century are located. Guided tours are regularly arranged inside the City of Brussels Town Hall.

2. Royal Palace of Brussels *Free*

4. Atonium €

5. Brussels City Museum €

Within this majestic building is a museum providing a comprehensive overview of Brussels' history including arts, crafts, urbanism and architecture. The museum is also home to the original Manneken Pis with it's over 130 costumes donated by cities around the world.
