I ATTENDED MY first Farm Progress Show more than 30 years ago at the Amana Colonies. Now for 2022, I will be attending the show as Wallaces Farmer's

editor. A lot has changed over the years.

The annual event has made its way back to the semipermanent site east of Boone in central Iowa after being canceled in 2020 due to the pandemic and being held in 2021 in Decatur, Ill.

The Farm Progress Show has been the nation's leading and largest outdoor farm show since it was first held in 1953. The tradition continues for 2022, featuring new technology, equipment and farm management practices to make America's farmers more efficient.

This year's show will be held Aug. 30 to Sept. 1 and is the seventh time the show will be held at this site, also known as the Central Iowa Expo site. The grounds are host to other events and activities throughout the year when the Farm Progress Show is not being held.

Look for those of us donning the Farm Progress polos and stop us to say hello or visit the Wallaces Farmer Hospitality Tent on the exhibit field. We always want

to hear from our readers about what is important on your operation.

The central lowa location is close to major highways and a variety of hotels and restaurants. Iowa State University is just a few miles away in Ames. My alma mater is a leader in education and research important to agriculturists around the world. The show and its host publication, Wallaces Farmer, have a long-standing relationship with ISU.

By holding the show at the same location for several years to come, we are able to feature upgraded improvements to the site. Buildings and long-term facilities provide visitors and exhibitors with a more productive experience.

Legacy important to show's host families, farmers

FAMILIES AND FARMERS make the Farm Progress Show possible each year. The host families, including the Ziels, the Isaacsons and the Schoffs own the land used for parking and field demonstrations around the permanent biennial site near Boone, Iowa.

For 10 years, Don Uthe has been farming a large portion of the ground around the show. Farming is nothing new to Uthe as he started right out of high school and has grown his operation and business to now include his sons, Scott and Kevin.

"Farming has been in our family since the early 1900s, and it just becomes part of your life and your lifestyle," he says.

Uthe added an agricultural inputs business to include the selling of seed, fertilizer and fuels to other farmers, which also can help his own operation.

Farming near the Ames city limits has been more of a challenge recently with growth of the city. The farm where Uthe lives is where his mother grew up, so it holds a special place for them. Corn and soybeans are the norm on his farm and the other farms he cares for, such as the one on the Farm Progress Show site.

"I've been helping farm the ground around the show since 2012 and started custom-farming it in 2019 since I lived closer and could get my equipment there easier," Uthe says.

He also enjoys being able to visit the show to learn more about the newest and best technologies, equipment and genetics. This year's crop was planted later than usual due to cold, wet spring conditions. A shorter-season hybrid is used in hopes of the maturity being correct for the harvest demonstrations.

"This experience has helped us learn more about short-season corn and how to manage it," Uthe says. "We know it will be harvested the end of August or first of September, and can expect the need for extra drying once it gets in the bin. The corn not used in the demonstrations can be left for further maturing and more prime harvest conditions."

LEGACY

June Isaacson turned 95 years old in late June. She has been a proponent of the Farm Progress Show since it began on the Boone site in 2008. In her years, she has seen farming change tremendously. She's amazed by the continual new technology and products exhibitors bring to the show.

Isaacson and her late husband, Warren, were dairy farmers and milked cows for 27 years. She's lived on the farm for 75 years. The family farm is east of the exhibit area, and Isaacson lives on the farm, which has been in the family since the late 1930s.



Overnight parking info

RV and camper parking are available at the Farm Progress Show north of the showgrounds in an alfalfa parking lot.

There is no fee to park, and no facilities are provided. The grounds are open for camper and RV parking after noon Aug. 29. To access the overnight parking lot, follow the regular traffic signs for visitor parking.

On show days, you can follow the regular visitor routing, and parking staff will move you to the correct lot after show hours for overnight parking.



familiarizing yourself with the directions is recommended.

Improvements are being made to Highway 17 — the road from Highway 30 that goes north

into the showgrounds. A major upgrade to Highway 17 includes adding a third lane into the show site. This extra lane is going to make your trip to the show easier.

But as you travel to the show, watch for any directions given by local law enforcement. There might be contingencies for managing traffic to speed you in and out of the show.



Outdoor events and severe weather don't mix



FARM PROGRESS SHOW TEAM @FPSHOW

THERE WAS A time when the Farm Progress Show team waited out storms at outdoor events. The idea was to stay put on the site and let the storm blow over. Those days are long gone.

The power of lightning to reach out from great distances is a constant fear for any outdoor show. To understand the nature of storms and create a safer space for visitors, show staff have all taken special training.

Matt Jungmann, events director; Rick Wild, operations manager; and Dena Morgan, events marketing, trained with experts from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and the National Weather Service.

The agencies conduct a two-day seminar that provides information designed to aid event, sports and venue professionals in preparing for and responding to dangerous weather conditions.

This training program looks at the

range of weather that can occur at an outdoor event, including lightning, high winds, hail and tornadoes.

TRIGGER CHART

At the training, Wild learned how to create a custom "trigger chart," which provides staff, volunteers, exhibitors, vendors and all people directly involved with the event a list of actions designed to keep people safe.

The custom chart on the previous page shows the level of detail that goes into planning for a safe event. The colors, and actions, range from green — which is good — to red — which is weather that could end the show.

With that trigger chart, everyone knows in advance what the process will be if the weather turns bad. And no one wants to see conditions in the red.

Wild, who has more than 25 years of experience doing outdoor events, has found this trigger chart to be a game-changer for management. This chart shows what to do as severe weather moves in, from knowing what to announce on the public-address system to what will be reported over the radio system for event team members.

Morgan notes that the two-day training was an eye-opener to her, even in the way weather stats are reported.

"Just because it says there's a 30% chance of rain, that doesn't mean what you think it does," she says. "You could actually have 100% chance of rain with that statistic based on where you are."

She adds that the knowledge gained also makes her more confident about decisions regarding actions at outdoor shows. Over the years, rain and high winds have caused problems for the shows. With this knowledge, the events team is better able to react to keep visitors, exhibitors and staff safe.

LIGHTNING RISK

Lightning is a bigger issue than many people think, especially for an outdoor event.

Generally, if the lightning is within 12 miles of an area, you would get a warning. If within 8 miles, there's a warning and potential evacuation. And if it gets closer than 5 miles, the area is evacuated and the show is closed.

What many people don't often understand is that a storm 10 miles away can send lightning pretty far in any direction. That's always a danger for an outdoor event.

For on-site staff, that trigger chart is the key. Every staff member involved with the show knows the drill if the weather changes.

KEEPING UP ON ALERTS

There are several ways to know what's happening at the show:

Show website. FarmProgressShow.com is the main website where alerts will show up if needed.

Twitter. Go to *twitter.com/fpshow* or *@FPShow* to get immediate alerts as conditions change.

Facebook. The Farm Progress Show Facebook page — *facebook.com/farm progressshow* — will also have updated information if conditions change.

2022 Farm Progress Show app. Downloading the latest app from iTunes or Google Play will keep you informed. The staff can send alerts to your cellphone if weather conditions warrant. Be sure to select the 2022 version of the app.

As part of the role of monitoring the weather, Farm Progress staff works with

National Weather Decision Technologies out of Norman, Okla.

"We work with those folks, and if bad weather comes up, we get immediate alerts," Wild says. "That happens during setup, the show itself and teardown. Anytime we have people on-site, we get alerted and can take action."

Weather conditions for an outdoor show are more important than ever. The Farm Progress events team is keeping its eyes on the sky.



SHINING A SPOTLIGHT ON AG INNOVATION

Farm Next series showcases emerging inventors and their new ideas

he world of agricultural innovation has exploded, fueled by significant investments in the industry. But who are these innovators? What are they developing? How will these breakthrough innovations change the landscape of the industry, and where can farmers learn more? Farm Next, a new, original series from Pivot Bio, in partnership with Farm Progress, will shine a spotlight on 10 of these ag innovators.

According to Pivot Bio co-founder and CEO Karsten Temme, Farm Next is "a search for the next set of innovations that are going to help solve the problems we face today and the problems we'll face tomorrow."

Pivot Bio was one of the next set of innovations just a decade ago when its co-founders envisioned a better nitrogen fertilizer. Now, their microbial nitrogen fertilizer has gone from vision to product, having been available to farmers for four years. With more and more farmers using Pivot Bio, the company has matured from a new startup into a more established business, and now it's time to pay it forward.

Farm Next does just that by shining a spotlight on agricultural innovators, creating a platform for them to share their stories and provide support in new ways. "And with the lessons we've learned, I think there's a lot we might be able to share with other innovators out there at the start of their journey," Temme says.

Participants will be featured in a series of 12 episodes on RFD-TV. Airing on Mondays at 7 p.m. Central time starting July 11, episodes will also be available for streaming at pivotbio.com/farm-next.

Episodes feature innovators meeting with a panel of business leaders, ag experts and farmers, hoping to glean a little bit of their knowledge for themselves.

"The idea is to bring in these innovators at the start of the journey, hear their stories, get a look under the hood and better understand what they're trying to build," Temme says.

Phil Stanhope, director of marketing at Pivot Bio, says the show helps capture these unique ag tech stories and broadcast them to farmers. "It didn't take us long to identify the companies," he says. "With this many interesting tech startups in this industry, there is no shortage of great stories to be told."

From robots to cover crops

With the 10 companies, Pivot Bio has captured a range of new ideas for agriculture. One, in particular, caught Stanhope's attention. "My brother lost his leg at 19 in a grain auger accident," he says. "When I saw the Grain Weevil, which breaks up that crust down to the auger, it really resonated with me."

Agriculture is a diverse industry, and the startups featured in Farm Next are equally diverse. While the Grain Weevil hits home as a safety tool, others include:

- technology allowing a diesel truck to burn ethanol
- a cover crop doubling as a cash crop, all while improving soil health
- software that can help farmers better plan equipment management
- a tool that kills weeds using electricity

Each episode features a different startup, which Stanhope says will put their names before more farmers, as well as a broader audience. ""Society, as a whole, does not fully appreciate how many innovation and technology advances are being made in agriculture," he says. "Ag is one of the most exciting segments of the entire marketplace."

Farmers will get a chance to meet these innovators and see their ideas close up. Pivot Bio is providing space at the Farm Progress Show next to its own exhibit for these companies to be on hand. "They can have conversations with farmers about what they're doing and how they're doing it," Stanhope says.

"We're looking forward to highlighting these new inventions and ideas in front of farmers that come to the Farm Progress Show," says Tracy Willits, vice president of communications at Pivot Bio. "We are so thrilled to talk about what they're doing and get the whole world excited about what's next."

MEET THE FARM NEXT STARTUPS

ClearFlame Engine Technologies

Working to create a clean heavy-duty industry by decarbonizing the fuel used by diesel engines, the first innovation the company has launched is a system that allows diesel engines to run on ethanol, a low-carbon, renewable fuel.

Ag Robot

The Flex-Ro, short for flexible robot, was built by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's Biological Systems Engineering Department. Santosh Pitla leads the team developing the smaller machine that uses its sensors to take a variety of measurements. CoverCress has converted field pennycress using advanced breeding and gene-editing tools to create a climate-smart agricultural product. The renewable oilseed and animal feed crop has a winter annual growth cycle allowing it to fit into an existing corn-and-soybean rotation. See *CoverCress.com*.

VergeAg is the creator of Launch Pad, the world's first interactive solution that helps farmers plan their operations specific to seeding, spraying and harvest. Yard Stick

Yard Stick is an in-situ soil carbon and bulk density measurement technology. Using the Yard Stick spectral hardware, a farmer can quickly capture, map, track, audit and share soil carbon data. Crop.Zone

Creator of the volt.fuel Electrical Weeding System,
Crop.Zone has developed a system using a conductive
fluid combined with an electrical charge to kill target plants.
The system is herbicide-free, providing a new approach to
weed burndown, terminating cover crops and desiccating

Grain Weevil

Grain Weevil is a grain bin safety and management robot that directly engages the surface of the grain to break up crusted material. This reduces the need for farmers to enter bins for greater safety. The system can also boost workflow efficiency in grain management and improve grain quality. See *GrainWeevil.com*.

The Salin 247 fully autonomous drive system can be used for planting, spraying and sidedressing nitrogen. The lightweight design reduces compaction while providing for timely work throughout the season. See Salin 247 inc. com.

Phospholutions is the creator of RhizoSorb, a product designed to support plant uptake of phosphorus more efficiently. In addition, the product complements a range of fertilizer inputs and amendments to improve soil conditions. See *Phospholutions.com*.

Farm Next highlights innovations in agriculture

NO QUESTION ABOUT it, agriculture has garnered plenty of attention in the investment community, and that is starting to yield new products and ideas for farmers.

Pivot Bio, a company that 10 years ago was a startup itself, wants farmers to see where ag innovation is going. The company has partnered with Farm Progress to do that by bringing 10 startup firms to the show as part of the Farm Next program.

The program, which started in July in a series of television specials on RFD-TV — later shown online — highlighted these companies. The culmination of that program is the Farm Progress Show exhibit — which is a first for both partners.

"It is rare for companies like this to be on hand at the show. Often, it's a few years before farmers can see this tech, but the Farm Next exhibit is very exciting," says Matt Jungmann, Farm Progress national events director.

Notes Karsten Temme, co-founder and CEO, Pivot Bio: "Farm Next is a search for the next set of innovations that are going to help solve the problems we face today and the problems we'll face tomorrow."

Pivot Bio was one of those startups a decade ago when its co-founders developed a better nitrogen fertilizer. That microbial nitrogen fertilizer has gone from vision to product, having been available to farmers for the last four years. With Pivot Bio going on more acres, the company has matured from startup to an established


business. This exhibit partnership is the company's way of paying it forward for the next round of innovators.

The Farm Next program also creates a platform for those startups to share their stories and provide support in new ways, working with Pivot Bio. "And with the lessons we've learned, I think there's a lot we might be able to share with other innovators out there at the start of their journey," Temme says.

DIVERSIFIED INNOVATIONS

The 10 companies highlight a range of new ideas for agriculture. Farmers are likely to be inspired by what they see — from the Grain Weevil, which can bust up crusted grain and keep farmers out of bins, to ClearFlame Engine Technologies, creator of a system that allows diesel engines to run on ethanol.

Others in the list include a company that has developed a cover crop that can double as a cash crop, adding new income to the corn-soybean rotation. There's software to better plan equipment use. For cattle producers, a firm has developed a virtual fence for pasture management. And

there's even a startup that has figured out how to kill weeds with electricity.

"This will be the first time farmers will get to see all these startups in one place," Jungmann says. "It's going to be an excellent look at what's ahead for farming."

Adds Tracy Willits, vice president of communications at Pivot Bio: "We're looking forward to highlighting these new inventions and ideas in front of farmers that come to the Farm Progress Show."

See machines in action

SHINY MACHINES, WHERE even the tires glow, is great to see in person at a farm show. But watching those machines work the field is what sets the Farm Progress Show apart. Many may have made the trip to Decatur, Ill., in 2021. But if you hadn't and Boone is your show site of choice, you've been "deprived" of equipment action since 2018.

Crops were planted in time to be harvested when gates open Aug. 30. "We got it done in the nick of time, given how much rain we got early in the season," show manager Matt Jungmann says. "The site has taken a couple of heavy rains this season, but everything is on track for harvest."

Jungmann and Rick Wild, operations manager for the show, have been getting the Boone demo fields ready for visitors.

And manufacturers are getting ready, too. Given how the 2022 supply chain situation has been going, getting specifics on what will be in the field has been more challenging, Jungmann says. "But we'll have plenty to see."

WEATHER MATTERS

An outdoor farm show offers the space to show a lot of equipment, but Mother Nature has her own plans for any outdoor event. If conditions change on-site, you can keep up on the demos in a few ways:

FPS app. Download 2022 Farm Progress Show app and turn on notifications.

Text service. Use the mobile text service by texting "FPS" to 20505. Respond to the next text to ensure you're on the list. Even if already on the FARM list to get daily texts from Farm Progress, you need to opt into the service under FPS to get the show texts. Text message rates do apply, and you can opt out at any time.

Social media sites. *@FPShow* on Twitter and the Farm Progress Show Facebook page will have regular updates, too.

The map at right shows where demonstrations will be each day. But save some walking and head to the tram stop on the east side of the showgrounds. Those drivers will get you to the right field.

SO MUCH TO SEE

Here are just some of the demos to catch: **Corn combining.** Starting 11 a.m. daily,

the demo gets large crowds, so arrive a little early. You'll see the latest combines from the major makers — some that have not been shown on the market until now.

Along with those combines, new auger carts will collect grain on the go. And you might find a not-so-new combine that has a new corn head with new tech, too.

Tillage. These run from 2 to 3 p.m. Arrive early because this one can go fast, especially with vertical tillage tools. Tillage technology has advanced a lot in the last five years with the advent of combo tools that provide on-the-go potential to change gang angles to manage residues.


Autonomy. On the east side near tram

loading, watch equipment of the future at work. Raven will be operating the latest versions of its OmniPower and OmniDrive equipment. And Solinftec will show its infield robot taking in data autonomously.

Drones. Running between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. daily, crop protection application machines and more will offer up their "hands-off" tech.

SAFETY MATTERS

Longtime show visitors know that staying behind the rope when machines are running keeps everyone safe. Follow directions given from the sound system and the safety team on the ground.







Find ways to get work done at autonomy demos

FARMERS ARE STARTING down a road to autonomy, but it's not an overnight move. Rising use of automation in machinery has allowed farmers to be more efficient and improve practices from tillage to planting to harvest. And fully autonomous vehicles are becoming a reality. At the Farm Progress Show, visitors can see some of these new tools in action.

Raven Industries returns to the Farm Progress show with its OmniPower and OmniDrive driverless machines, and Meagan Huisman, marketing strategist, says Raven's goal is to work with farmers on their tech journey.

"We want to talk to the farmer about the path to autonomy," she says. "Raven is committed to helping farmers better utilize their resources through technology, helping to reduce fatigue, improve safety, increase sustainability and essentially do more with less."

She says at the 2022 show, Raven is inviting farmers to "join us on the path to autonomy and take strides forward to integrate advanced technology into their operation and improve their farm."

The key is that farmers are at different points on that path, and the discussion with Raven when visiting the exhibit will be around determining where an individual farmer is on the journey and where their farm needs to go.

"There are five levels on the path to autonomy. Level 1 is precision farming, where each layer of technology is operated independently," Huisman says. "Each new level on the path adds more automation — from coordination and optimization to operatorassisted autonomy, supervised autonomy and, finally, to full autonomy."

In the exhibit field, Raven has redesigned the experience to collaborate with farmers on the path to autonomy, providing an air-conditioned environment to discuss the tech and help farmers explore where they are on their journey.

At the field demonstration, Raven has upgraded its Command Center to provide a viewing deck, so farmers can get a good look at the driverless machines as they move through the demonstration area.

Adds Rachel Hennen, marketing strategist at Raven: "We have reinvented the Command Center to be a really cool experience. We know that putting our technology in the hands of our customers or potential customers helps them feel more comfortable with it and builds trust in the solutions we're providing."

OmniDrive makes a tractor with a grain cart an autonomous "harvest helper." OmniPower is the driverless power platform that can be used for different tasks, depending on what it's mated to, such as a granular spreader or a full-size sprayer.

In addition to the observation deck, a tent will provide shade for visitors to the field demonstrations.

A DIFFERENT KIND OF AUTONOMY


Solinftec is innovating in-field data gathering with its autonomous technology.

"We're going to have our scouting robot at work in the demonstration," says Ben Brame, North American product manager at Solinftec. "We'll have three units at work. And what's going to be fun is that we're bringing in some corn plants in a plot, so you'll see the robot moving live through that field."

The solar-powered robot is designed to be continuously at work in the field. The company has machines working in Illinois in a partnership with Growmark. The effort is expanding in 2023.

"We're showing the data we can collect, and we have the robot outfitted with all kinds of cameras," Brame says. "I think the real value is with image recognition. We're in the process of building up our library of what we can automatically detect with our images — insects, weeds, diseases. We can identify weed species, height, density, and help make economic decisions."

With its machine-learning model, the more information each of these autonomous machines gathers helps make the software even better. Over time, Brame says the new tech can be used to measure plant health, stand counts, growth stage and nutrient-use efficiency.

First-aid support ready if needed

YOU DON'T WANT trouble to strike. But bring a crowd of people together for three days under a hot sun and things can happen. And the Farm Progress Show is ready with emergency medical technicians on hand.

"We provide paramedic-level service at the show site," says John DeLavergne, with Boone County Ambulance. "We have a full crew with paramedic gear, but our main job is first aid. If there is a problem, we'll need to transport them either to Boone or to Mary Greeley in Ames."

So far in Boone, the temperatures have been mild, he says. "We've not seen the hot days that Decatur [III.] sometimes gets," he says. "We're biding our time, and so far, we've been lucky."

There are two first-aid locations on the show site. The first is in the Administration Building on the south side of the show site.

New for 2022 is a trailer that will be positioned on the north side of the site next to Gate 1.

"We got a new support trailer with COVID dollars," DeLavergne says. The 36foot trailer is air-conditioned, providing

another stop for show attendees who may be experiencing issues.

SOME TIPS FOR SHOW

While most of what DeLavergne and his crew have been asked to provide is ibuprofen and bandages during the show, $they \, are \, ready \, for \, major \, health \, issues. \, And \,$ he has some tips for attendees to consider.

"People don't think about the fact that parts of the show are paved and that reflects heat," he says. "Even if it's not a warm day, you can see a 20-degree temperature difference" between areas.

His advice? Drink water, and don't consider that Pepsi you downed as a substi-

"People just don't stop to drink water, but that can make a lot of difference," DeLavergne says.

When at the show, play it safe:

- Wear comfortable shoes.
- Stay hydrated.
- Dress in clothing that protects your skin from the sun.
- Use sunscreen.







Soy-based asphalt now floor of industries tent

A WALK THROUGH an outdoor farm show is an informative experience, but it can sometimes mean switches in "terrain" from gravel to grass to wood chips to concrete. It's part of the experience. But when attending the Farm Progress Show in Boone, visitors will have a different experience at the Varied Industries Tent with a new asphalt base.

A new 600-by-60-foot asphalt pad will greet visitors to the 2022 show, but this is not "everyday asphalt." The product uses soy and is sponsored by the Iowa Soybean Association.

"Infrastructure and demand are two priorities for Iowa soybean farmers," says Robb Ewoldt, Iowa Soybean Association president. "The use of soy-based asphalt will not only improve the capabilities and usability of the Central Iowa Expo grounds, but showcase the many applications for soy."

Ewoldt, who farms near Davenport, says ISA has invested in research and technology to make soy-based asphalt a reality.

"We're excited to bring it to the Central Iowa Expo grounds to improve its use for patrons and vendors," he says.

"We're creating an enhanced experience for visitors attending the show by upgrading the VIT area with this asphalt," show manager Matt Jungmann says. "Farmers and exhibitors will find this new surface creates a better environment for the show."

BUILDING ON RESEARCH

The paving project is an extension of Iowa State University Research formulating

high-oleic soybean oil to replace other expensive, highly volatile compounds used as a binder in the creation of asphalt products. That research was funded by the lowa Soybean Association.

"Iowa Soybean Association is driven to deliver greater production, demand and profitability for Iowa's 40,000 soybean farmers," Ewoldt says. "Soy's incorporation in asphalt enhances the product's durability and longevity, and reduces maintenance costs.

"It also increases demand for soybean oil, enhances environmental quality and provides the Central Iowa Expo greater flexibility in the events it attracts and hosts."

Biopolymer asphalt has been used in various projects throughout Iowa and more are slated in other states.

Research and testing on the biopolymer product continues as ISU pushes the product toward commercialization. About two-thirds of the potential market for the soy-based product is public, including roads maintained by the state's department of transportation.

"We're excited to bring this new technology to the Farm Progress Show," says Don Tourte, a senior vice president at Farm Progress. "Any way we can improve the site for visitors and exhibitors while also encouraging new uses for our farmers' crops creates benefits for everyone."

Ewoldt says the project is a win-win for lowa soybean farmers, Central Iowa Expo and the Farm Progress Show. "Featuring soy in such a prominent location will advance awareness and understanding of the product's versatility and benefits, while making the expo grounds more usable and accessible for guests for years and decades to come," he says.


RECYCLING PART OF PROJECT

The material used in the project is a cold-in-place technology. It will use 100% recycled asphalt pavement mixed with the soybean-based product.

The soy-based asphalt project will encompass nearly 36,000 square feet and use 3,500 pounds of soybean oil. Each bushel of soybeans yields about 10.7 pounds of oil. Oil derived from up to 327 bushels of soybeans were used in the project.

The specific amount of oil used in any asphalt project varies by the quality of the reclaimed asphalt pavement, its moisture content and the desired final density of the pavement.





Follow rules if driving golf cart to get around

THE GOLF CART has become a fixture at farm shows to get around, but a few rules need to be followed to keep everyone safe.

Only golf carts and motorized scooters are allowed on the exhibit field at the 2022 Farm Progress Show. No vehicles that will idle unattended — lawn mowers, utility vehicles, ATVs or other similar machines — will be permitted.

Other golf cart information follows:

Renting. Visitors can rent a golf cart from the FPS-approved vendor M&M Golf Cars. Call 573-581-8188, ext. 121. The rental fee includes the permit required to enter the grounds.

Golf carts will be located near Gate 1 on the north side of the showgrounds.

Bring your own. Visitors can bring personal golf carts but will be required

to purchase a permit from the golf cart vendor located just west of the southwest entrance. The permit is \$80 for the day.

Watch that speed. There's a speed limit; keep that golf cart below 5 mph.

Stick to streets. Golf carts may not be used to enter an exhibit. They must remain in the street without obstructing access to the exhibit space.

Many exhibitors are now adding cart parking as an option. Operators who drive into exhibits and tents will lose their permit, and their golf cart will be removed.

Keep your keys. Operators must remove the key from the vehicle when vacated.

Rider limit. A golf cart may not transport more individuals than it has seats for.

No attachments. No pull-behind attach-

ments to golf carts are permitted.

Minimum age. Golf cart operators must be at least 25 years old.

Safety first. Drivers shall operate the vehicle in a safe and prudent manner.

Management's discretion. In those situations where questions arise relative to any aspect of these rules and regulations, Farm Progress Show management shall be responsible for all final decisions.

Looking for seat time behind wheel?

A STATIC DISPLAY of new machines you haven't ever seen, or want to get closer to, makes an outdoor farm show special. Roll in the field demonstrations where you can see machines at work, and that's a bonus. But what about the opportunity to get behind the wheel of a new machine and test it yourself?

For 2022, the Farm Progress Show Ride 'n' Drive area, located on the east side of the showgrounds near tram loading and next to the autonomy demonstrations, will be a popular place this year. Farmers who make their way to that side of the showgrounds will have a chance to experience a range of new machines and technology.

Case IH announced the Patriot 50 sprayer series late in 2021, and the machines will be hitting the field later this year. Farmers visiting the show cannot

only see the new sprayer, but also get some seat time.

The company started fresh with the sprayer and redesigned it from nose to boom. From a new cab using the same shell as the Steiger tractor to a familiar control layout common to other machines in the Big Red line, the Patriot 50 sprayer brings plenty of new features to the market.

AUTOSTEERING VEHICLE

The utility vehicle has become a fixture on a lot of farms, often replacing the pickup for getting chores done. And each year UTV makers raise their game, bringing new tools and tech to check out.

new machines, both of which will be in the Ride 'n' Drive area — the AutoTrac Ready Gator and new Signature Gator.

The AutoTrac Ready full-size Gator UTV has AutoTrac-assisted steering in a smaller, more nimble machine. With this tech, farmers can get help with precise grid sampling, spraying and field boundary creation.

The Signature Edition Gator, introduced earlier this year, will also be available. This automotive-inspired vehicle has leather seats, an integrated touchscreen "infotainment" system and high-end audio.

PLENTY MORE ON HAND

Beyond the Deere area, farmers will find Chevy trucks, including the upgraded Silverado. Seat time in these new trucks offers you a chance to learn more about the features these working vehicles offer.

Agco will have equipment in the Ride 'n' Drive area, too. The company has





Quick look at key services

WHEN THE GATES open at the Central Iowa Expo for the 2022 Farm Progress Show, the first since 2018, it's like firing up a new town for the first time.

This miniature city comes with parking, public transportation, emergency services, air-conditioned restrooms, food and various other services. Check out this list to find out more:

Airport transportation. The Boone Municipal Airport is 2.5 miles west of the show site. The Ames Municipal Airport is 8 miles to the east. Both offer a free shuttle service to and from the show. From Boone, no reservations are necessary; from Ames,

reservations are required.

Show office. The office is in the Administration Building outside the grounds at the south end of Sixth Street (Gate 6) on the south side of the exhibit field.

First aid. First-aid stations are located at each end of Sixth Street. Just inside Gate 1, you'll find an air-conditioned first-aid trailer from Boone County Ambulance. At Gate 6, first-aid service is set up in the Administration Building. And first-aid support is on the showgrounds throughout the day for quick response.

Restrooms. Restrooms are located outside the entrances and within the four food court complexes at the center of each quadrant of the exhibit field — these are easily found by looking for the tall light poles located at the center of each quadrant. The northeast and southeast restroom facilities are permanent, air-conditioned buildings. See the map at the center of this program for more information.

Lost children. If you lose a child, check the nearest first-aid station, information booth or show office. See the map at the center of the program.

Lost and found. And lost items will be

brought to the show office.

Information booths. These one-stop shops offer you information not covered in this program, or can help with last-minute changes to each day's events. They are located at the entrances on either end of Sixth Street, as well as three locations on Central Avenue.

Handicap parking. The edge of the exhibit field in the North Parking Lot has been designated for handicapped parking.







Tractor walks on water

AT THE RETENTION pond on the east side of the Farm Progress Show grounds in Boone, there's a gravel ramp. It's not for launching a boat. It's for a tractor, which will show that the right flotation matters in managing soil compaction.

"This is an opportunity for us to start the conversation with the grower about the importance of flotation in their field," says Jeff Miller, marketing communications adviser at Trelleborg Wheel Systems. "And we're offering this extreme example. This is in no way a practical application; this is just fun."

The fun he refers to is a floating tractor, and Mitas is bringing back that demonstration project again to the Boone site.

Managing tire size and air pressure can help farmers reduce compaction in the field. This floating tractor pushes the idea to the limit. Miller says the idea originally came from Europe, but in that demonstration, they didn't use large enough front tires as they were not produced yet.

"They had to put supplemental flotation on the front of the machine," he says. "When we did this in 2018, we decided to make it happen with just tires."

DRIVING ON WATER

Matt Jungmann, national events director at Farm Progress, got some seat time in the machine in 2018. "It's a little unnerving to see water come up to the doors," he says. "When you enter the water, you sink in until the tires float. Then you're on water."

One thing Jungmann learned is how to steer a tractor on water — not something every farmer has to deal with. "You use the brakes," he says. "Push the right brake and the left wheels keep spinning, and you turn right. It's that simple."

The tractor will hit the water on the



hour during the show, "driving" for a short time before heading back to land. Visitors who saw this in 2018 noted there was no mud stirred up and the machine was indeed floating.

"It's a demonstration about having the

right tires in the right application, and we all know the importance of flotation," Miller says. "It can reduce compaction, increase yield and increase profits. We have a full line of VF tires to help farmers with their flotation."



2023 show returns to Decatur, III.



State patrol officers to help keep traffic moving

EACH YEAR THE traffic flows into the Farm Progress Show grounds during its three days. Getting over 20,000 vehicles in and out per day can be a challenge, but safety is the No. 1 goal for the Iowa State Patrol.

"We will have 35 officers helping get traffic moving safely and smoothly to the event," says Sgt. Corey Champlin with the Iowa State Patrol. "We want everyone to realize the more aware they are about their surroundings, the better it will all go."

The patrol works with surrounding agencies, Farm Progress Show representatives and the Iowa Department of Transportation to ensure all attending get in and out of the show safely.

PAY ATTENTION

Champlin says the busiest time is the first two hours of the morning when all of the exhibitors are trying to get to the show to man their booths, and farmers are trying to get there to take in all the show has to offer.

"If you come early, be patient. Make sure you have your seat

belt on and your phone is not in your hand," he adds.

Delays are expected in the early-morning traffic, as well as when everyone starts to leave in the evening. While it is easy to grab your phone to pass the time in traffic, he warns this is often when accidents and fender benders happen, which will slow

down traffic even more.

Close to the showgrounds is the United Community School, and Champlin says to take extra caution in that area when school buses and traffic are turning in and out of the school grounds. An officer will be on hand to help students and staff get in and out safely. "We are there to help get drivers where they need to go," he says, adding that drivers need to continue in the direction they're sent to reach their destination.

DETOUR AND REROUTING

North of the Farm Progress Show grounds on Highway 17, the bridge over the railroad tracks

will not be completed by the time of the show. The detour around that area is well marked and easy to follow.

Champlin says there will be an extra lane of traffic into the grounds, which will also be well marked for travelers. Digital signs will provide any last-minute information for drivers.

"We suggest listening to local radio stations [WHO radio] for traffic updates, especially in the morning hours, and visiting the website to check for any extra information before traveling to the show," Champlin says.

Traffic updates are expected on WHO radio around 6:30 a.m. and 8 a.m., and again in the late afternoon to get everyone in and out of the show quickly and safely.

"If weather permits, we will have one of our aircrafts monitoring traffic from above," he says. "That way we can make necessary adjustments more quickly to help traffic flow."

Parking will be marked with signs, and officers will help direct attendees into the proper areas from all directions.

IT TAKES MORE than 25 utility vehicles to transfer staff and parts during the Farm Progress Show. And for 2022, Polaris will supply the official off-road vehicles for the Farm Progress Show.

"Polaris has been a longtime supporter of Farm Progress events and looks forward to being able to connect with our customers at these events each year," says Chris Judson, vice president of ORVs at Polaris.

He says the Polaris brand is trusted by farmers, ranchers and homeowners, so "it is a natural fit for us to support Farm Progress events with our vehicles."

He says the Polaris ORVs are up to the task in pulling off a big event like the Farm Progress Show, with the ability to haul heavy loads and offer comfort to make long work days feel shorter.

RANGER XP 1000

Polaris is known for its full line of allterrain and utility vehicles, and visitors will see different models and types of Polaris ORVs on the grounds. But one model that will be prominent is the RANGER XP 1000.

Smartphone app helps producers ID insects, form treatment plans

SCOUTING FIELDS FOR insect pressure is a necessary — although sometimes daunting — task involved with producing a crop. Thanks to the artificial intelligence technology being developed by Iowa State University, crop scouting is on the way to becoming a lot easier and more efficient.

Arti Singh and her team of AI and crop experts are planning to release a beta version of a phone app at this year's Farm Progress Show, capable of identifying insects based on a photo. What's more, the app can also tell the user whether the

insect is beneficial or a pest, and if it's a pest, what species it is. The released version of the app will also tell which stage of life the insect is in, and how to mitigate it.

Singh, an assistant professor in agronomy at Iowa State, has spent her entire career in plant breeding, diseases, genomics and phenomics. Even so, she says identifying and understanding insects can be complex.

"Insect are reported to have the largest total biomass of terrestrial animals and over 90% of animal life form on Earth. I often see an insect, but I don't know whether it's beneficial or a pest due to sheer huge

number of insect species, and like a lot of people, I get worried and assume it needs to be killed, but this is not always true," she says. "The producer needs to be able to differentiate between which insects are good and bad, to save time and money in the field, and this becomes even more important in the case of new crops."

TECHNOLOGY HELPS FARMERS

The phone app is being trained to recognize and distinguish more than 1,000 different insect species, making it useful not only in Iowa and other states, but also in countries across the world.

Singh and her team are pairing the phone app with other forms of AI, including unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs or drones) and in-field robots, with the goal of synchronizing the crop scouting process and essentially allowing AI to do the work.

The vision of her team is to use drones for an overhead, broad view of fields to determine if and where insects are present, and when areas of damage are detected, the robots are sent into the field to identify the insects and provide spot-specific treatments of pesticide.

"The robot can work in small fields with specialty crops or large fields with conventional crops," Singh says. "Rather than scouting and treating the whole field, we are focusing on the individual plant level. We are trying to give a personalized treatment, versus a whole-field treatment."

In addition to the time and labor savings, farmers using AI can potentially save on the amount of pesticide used and the unintended consequences of pesticide use, including drift.

Singh and her team have been working on the technology for the past several years, and a preview was offered at the 2018 Farm Progress Show.

Her research has continued, and she has been awarded some prestigious grants to further develop and perfect the use of AI for pest management.

Singh says farmers have generally been appreciative of AI technology and how it can improve the work they do on the farm.

She says there has been some skepticism as to whether robots can treat pests in large fields, like those found in Iowa, but she is confident the technology can work on a large scale, especially when multiple robots are used, and when they operate day and night.

A team of robots is much lighter on the soil than traditional agricultural equipment, she says, and because robots are only going where they are sent, they do not necessarily need to travel the entire field.

"I'm working on something that at the end of the day, I believe is going to be useful for the farmer," Singh says. "The interest from farmers is strong, and the demand for AI in agriculture continues to expand."

Weed seed destructor, other control methods showcased

CONTROLLING WEEDS IN farm fields is an annual challenge — especially with more weeds becoming resistant to herbicides. Fortunately, producers have a wide range of options to counter weeds, including some creative ways that may not have been employed in the past.

At this year's Farm Progress Show, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will showcase one of the more innovative and practical methods of controlling weeds: a weed seed destructor.

Fitted to a combine, the weed seed destructor does what its name implies. It pulverizes and destroys seeds so that they cannot germinate.

The weed seed destructor (Redekop) will be attached to the back of a John Deere S680 combine and will be available for viewing outside of the ISU Extension and Outreach tent.

While the machine will not be operating during the show, visitors can see it in operation on a computer screen, and they can ask questions of weed science experts.

"We want to give the public a chance to see and ask about this innovative form of weed control technology," says Prashant Jha, professor and Extension weed specialist at Iowa State. "Farmers in central Iowa and in Harrison County are already using this technology, and we expect more will do so in the coming years."

ALTERNATIVE METHODS

Other methods of weed control will also be featured, including videos of chaff lining, a method that guides the harvested chaff into narrow bands as it flows out the back of the combine at harvest, which reduces the spread of weed seeds by more than 95% across fields and contains weed seeds in smaller spaces.

The harvester or combine is modified with a baffle that separates the chaff (containing the majority of weed seeds) from the straw. The chaff is directed into narrow central bands using a chute at the rear of the combine.

Weed seeds in the chaff are subjected to decay, and burial of small-seeded weed species such as waterhemp in the chaff will potentially result in reduced emergence in the subsequent growing season. High application rates of herbicides or shielded sprayers can be used to selectively control emerged weeds in those narrow bands in the field.

The weed control display will also allow visitors the chance to test their knowledge of weed specimens found in the Midwest. Sixteen different species will be available for visitors to identify.

Visitors will also have the chance to learn more about waterhemp, and how it can be suppressed using cereal rye as a cover crop.

Photos and sample trays will show the results of using no rye, rye terminated at 4 to 6 inches tall, and rye terminated close to heading.

"We're going to be showing the potential for biomass [cover crops] to suppress weeds like waterhemp, and how the results

vary based on the height of the cover crop," Jha says.

RYE HELPS SUPPRESS WEEDS

Cereal rye has the best potential to suppress weeds because it accumulates more biomass than other cover crop species. A study that was done for the Farm Progress Show shows an incremental decrease in waterhemp based on the density of rye.

Field studies indicate cereal rye biomass of 4,500 to 5,000 pounds per acre at termination can significantly suppress waterhemp emergence in soybeans, and reduce the size and density

of waterhemp at the time of exposure to postemergence herbicides.

Additionally, producers can view a map of where herbicide resistance has been documented in Iowa based on the recent survey, and ask questions to Jha and other specialists about their own experience with herbicideresistant weeds.

Jha will be joined at the show by ISU Extension and Outreach field agronomists Angie Rieck-Hintz, Meaghan Anderson, Gentry Sorenson and Mike Witt, and several weed science graduate students.

Specialists to discuss latest carbon resources, opportunities at show

EMERGING OPPORTUNITIES FOR carbon markets and carbon sequestration have caught the attention of specialists with lowa State University Extension and Outreach. Everyone from agronomists to economists, livestock specialists and bioproduct researchers are on board with the effort to identify new opportunities and define the science of carbon as it pertains to agriculture.

"Carbon" is becoming a useful shorthand to capture many related topics, including soil organic matter, energy efficiency, capture of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, and reductions in the releases of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases.

At this year's Farm Progress Show, a team of specialists will be on hand to help explain the latest in carbon science and answer questions from the public.

"This truly is an interdisciplinary topic, and the solutions and opportunities are interdisciplinary," says Jim Jordahl, a project analyst with the Biorenewables Research Laboratory at Iowa State. "We think there's going to be emerging opportunities in livestock manure management,

agronomics and biomass-based fuels."

The carbon display will feature large computer monitors that explain agricultural carbon markets, how carbon can be managed on the farm, and the kinds of products that can be made from it.

Jordahl says many lowans already have some awareness of carbon, but he's

hoping the display will help broaden the public's understanding as to the possibilities and the work being done at Iowa State.

"Our intent is to convey information that we now have about carbon markets and relevant practices for Iowa, and summarize them in a way that people will understand and appreciate," he says.

CARBON WORK

One new product includes a 281-page report summoned by Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds' Carbon Sequestration Task Force. Released in February, "Carbon Science for Carbon Markets: Emerging Opportunities in Iowa" gives a detailed look at the progress, opportunities and challenges of establishing carbon markets in Iowa.

For those who want something shorter to read, they can check out a short, graphical summary, which gives a synopsis of carbon sequestration, and how agriculture can participate and benefit.

It is estimated that much of the state has lost 50% of its original soil carbon, but through practices such as no-till, extended crop rotations, cover crops, prairie strips and nitrogen management, lowa is well situated to store carbon and increase its soil organic matter along the way.

"lowa is uniquely well-positioned to create carbon value," according to the summary report. "We have the advantage of excellent soils and generally have adequate rainfall to produce crops without irrigation."

Carbon credit payments to farmers are only one piece to the puzzle. Good carbon management also often leads to increased nitrogen use efficiency, improved water quality and wildlife habitat.

Carbon can also be captured and turned into useful products such as biochar — an organic product produced by heating biomass from crop residues, wood and perennial grasses. Known as pyrolysis, this heating process results in a product that can be added to fields, gardens or yards as a versatile, long-lasting (centuries or more) soil amendment.

Pyrolysis also produces a thick, viscous liquid known as bio-oil, which can be refined into renewable diesel fuel or bio-asphalt, substituting the need for petro-leum-based asphalt. Jordahl says the team will have samples of both products at the show, so visitors can see two practical examples of what can be made from carbon.

The heating is done inside of a machine called a pyrolyzer. The Bioeconomy Institute at Iowa State developed its own demonstration-scale pyrolyzer, which was

recognized in April with a \$1 million award from XPrize Carbon Removal.

AGRONOMISTS TALK SEQUESTRATION

Extension agronomists will also be on hand to talk about how agronomic practices can increase the amount of carbon being sequestered. Field agricultural engineer Brian Dougherty will discuss the agronomic and livestock potential for carbon sequestration.

There will also be copies of a recent

report by Extension economist Alejandro Plastina, which compares and contrasts existing carbon credit companies.

Titled "How to Grow and Sell Carbon Credits in U.S. Agriculture," this 11-page report provides a simple overview of existing carbon credit companies and markets.

"The menu of carbon programs is growing daily, and there are multiple pathways to participate in carbon markets," Plastina says. "We want to showcase alternatives, and their implications for farmers' operations."

Staff and faculty from Iowa State will be at the carbon display each day of the show, to help answer questions and explain the latest trends in carbon science.

"We want to get the public to see that carbon science is a moving picture, with a lot of financial support and interest," Jordahl says. "There are next-generation farming practices and products to be aware of, and this is an exciting time for agriculture."



Learn to identify plant diseases, insect problems

IDENTIFYING WHAT TYPE of insect or plant disease is affecting your crops is a critical part in forming a response. Making the wrong decision can be costly and may have little to no effect on the issue at hand.

In order to help growers improve their identification skills, plant disease and insect diagnostic specialists with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will have displays of common insects and plant disease issues at this year's Farm Progress Show.

The samples will be based on the current growing season, and while it is still too soon to know exactly which pests and diseases will be most burdensome this year, the specialists are committed to helping show visitors improve their identification skills.

Microscopes will be available, and visitors can get a close-up view while interacting with specialists who study the same insects and diseases on a daily basis.

"Every year is variable as to what we will actually see," says Ed Zaworski, plant pathologist with the Plant and Insect Diagnostic Clinic at Iowa State. "Certain diseases like certain conditions, so we always talk to people about the disease triangle in plant pathology. You need three parts of a triangle to have a disease: the susceptible host, a pathogen and an optimal environment."

SCOUTING IS KEY

While farmers have many choices that can help prevent insect and disease issues, no system is ever foolproof. Good scouting is still key, followed by a prompt response plan when an issue is detected.

"When it comes to crop protection, you want to be proactive instead of reactive, but when something emerges, the next best thing is your response," says Erin Hodgson, Extension specialist in entomology at Iowa State.

"You want to identify what's going on, how widespread it is, and make a timely treatment that's going to protect your yield," she says. Zaworski and Hodgson will both be at the show, helping producers identify plant health issues and answering questions.

Although experienced farmers usually have a basic understanding of how to identify different pests, the display will allow them to test their skills and learn more about new and emerging pests.

Hodgson says every farmer's situation is different. Some may farm land in multiple parts of the county or state, and rely on crop consultants to diagnose plant health issues. Others do their own scouting or scout cooperatively with family members. No matter the situation or the size of the farm, it's beneficial for everyone to know what to look for and how to accurately identify the issues affecting plant health.

This is the first year for the plant health display at the Farm Progress Show, and the specialists are excited to bring this critical component to the public's eye.

Health and Safety Tent offers valuable information

HOW DO YOU feel? Is that a question you've asked yourself lately? When you're visiting the Farm Progress Show, perhaps getting an answer from a third party could be helpful. You'll have that chance at the Health and Safety Tent.

"I like the idea of having a lot of this health and safety education all in one place for people," says Marsha Cheyney, outreach coordinator for the Great Plains Center for Ag Health, based in Iowa City. "In my job, I do a lot of in-person outreach and education. This show offers the chance to reach so many more people."

Cheyney has put together a comprehensive plan for the Health and Safety Tent focused on demonstrations, safety education and more. You can find all of these services on the north end of the northeast quadrant at 37N.

DEMONSTRATIONS ON HAND

"We'll have an ATV Tilt Table in the tent showing what can happen if you get at the wrong angle with a machine," Cheyney says.

In addition, Agribility will be on hand to show ways equipment can be modified to make sure farmers can keep at it if tragedy occurs. They'll be demonstrating a tractor lift system that can help a farm get into the cab to do farm work. And there will be other demonstrations to check out, providing some hands-on insights into key safety and farm health topics.

WELLNESS AND SAFETY INSIGHTS

On the safety education side, visitors will have the chance to connect with a range of support services. "We'll have mental health support resources available for visitors; it's a growing issue in agriculture," Cheyney says.

In addition, there will be information

about grain bin safety and ways to prevent falls on the farm. In the past two years, there have been several grain bin entrapments in the Midwest; getting tips on ways to avoid trouble could pay off for your farm.

"We're also going to have a group on to talk about safety with gas containers," Cheyney says. "The Christopher Alsip Foundation was formed after the family lost a child to the explosion of a portable gas container. They provide a lot of education about that safety."

In addition, there will be presentations about personal protective equipment for use on the farm. This information will focus on the right PPE for specific tasks, including crop protection use on the farm.

Cheyney says the tent will also have areas where people can take a break with coffee and water available. "It's a place to pause from all that walking," she adds.



Improve monarch habitat with helpful resources

FARMERS, GARDENERS AND anyone with interest in helping monarchs thrive can get involved with the resources provided by Iowa State University Extension and Outreach. At this year's Farm Progress Show, specialists from Iowa State University and USDA will discuss recent efforts

to increase the population of this essential pollinator and resources to improve its numbers in the future.

The eastern population of monarch butterflies is holding steady, according to a report released in May by the World Wildlife Fund, which indicated a slight increase

increase in inhabited area, compared to last year. While this is good news, Nicole Shimp, program specialist with the Iowa Monarch Conservation Consortium, says there's still a long way to go.

"This is significant news, given the population saw a decrease last year," Shimp says. "We are celebrating this news and hoping the trend can continue. Sadly, we still have much more work to do before the monarch population can be considered sustainable."

The monarch is currently under consideration for listing as a threatened or endangered species by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

USFWS recommends continued implementation of voluntary conservation, with a decision on listing to come in 2024.

DISPLAY

Shimp and the team will display live monarch caterpillars and butterflies, while answering questions from visitors about monarch behavior and habitat. Educational YouTube videos will be played at the show, showing examples of monarch habitat.

The monarch team will provide samples of recent monarch publications from ISU Extension and Outreach, including "5 Ways to Help the Monarchs," "Enhancing Monarch Butterfly Conservation in Iowa," and "Monarch Seed Mix."

Farmers can help pollinators by participating in the Prairie Strip conservation project. Pioneered at Iowa State, these all-purpose buffers can be installed through or around a crop field, alongside waterways, or in a terrace channel.

Farmers and landowners can now apply for cost share to install prairie strips with the Conservation Reserve Program.

With a width of 30 to 120 feet, prairie strips can reduce erosion, improve water quality, and provide habitat for pollinators and other wildlife. There are more than

250 sites with prairie strips nationwide. Costs for this practice, known as CP43, may be as little as \$7 per acre.

A similar approach, "Establishing and Managing Pollinator Habitat on Saturated Riparian Buffers," is highlighted in a fourpage resource from ISU Extension that explains options, benefits and costs associated with enhancing riparian buffers with pollinator-friendly native plants.


For a digital connection to pollinators, check out the HabiTally mobile phone app. It's designed to helps people voluntarily record basic information about their habitat to support monarch recovery. The app allows people to record their efforts on plots of all sizes, and it can also be used to record community projects, including locations such as churches and parks.

You can enter your own plot and see data aggregated by state, including the number of habitat acres other states have reported. Developed in 2019 as a collaboration between Bayer and the Climate Corporation, with support from Iowa State's Center for Survey Statistics and Methodology, the app is available as a free download on iOS and Android devices from the App Store by searching HabiTally monarchs.

Shimp says people often think they need to own large tracts of land to help pollinators, but that's not always the case. Roadway ditches, lawns and landscapes can all make an ideal habitat if maintained properly.

Even those who do not own land can still help improve monarchs, through education and outreach to others.

"A lot of people have a strong interest in helping monarchs, but don't really know how to get started," Shimp says. "We hope our time at the show will help expose people to the resources and individuals who can help provide useful information, because there really are important things each of us can do."



International visitors welcomed to farm show

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL HAS been curtailed in the past two years, but the world is opening up and the Farm Progress Show will be ready.

"We're thrilled to host the International Visitors Center at the Farm Progress Show this year," says Peggy Kerr, team leader, International Trade Office, Iowa Economic Development Authority.

"It offers us the opportunity to showcase Iowa exhibitors, as our key role is to increase exports from Iowa."

Kerr explains that IEDA involvement aims to help connect exhibitors and companies to facilitate new trade opportunities. "And that's good for the overall economy," she adds. Kerr also indicated that the International Visitors Center is being restructured and modernized from what it has been in the past.

Before the pandemic, the Farm Progress Show welcomed visitors from more than 40countries every year. While that dipped significantly in 2021, Kerr sees an opportunity for more to return this year.

The center will be staffed throughout the show to support the business and tourism side for international guests. IEDA will work with the Ames, Boone and Des Moines Convention and Visitors Bureaus (CVB) to help staff the site during the show.

Of course, language can be a barrier for any international visitor, but the International Visitors Center will be provide resources. "We'll have Spanish and Portuguese interpreters on hand this year,"





Kerr says. The guests who travel to Boone from outside the U.S. often need some extra help, including official letters of invite, which are available from the Ames CVB, through a link on the farm show web-

Kerr says that international travel is

never a walk in the park, and COVID-19 added plenty of challenges, but with more of the world ending testing requirements, the doors are reopening.

"There will be pockets of the world still hesitant to travel, but we're seeing more openness than there was for Decatur in 2021." Kerr adds. International visitors can find key information at FarmProgressShow. com. Water quality efforts made visual

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY Extension will make water quality practices "more visual" at this year's Farm Progress Show.

Kay Stefanik, assistant director of the ISU Iowa Nutrient Research Center, says this year's exhibit will include a video on the water quality benefits of wetlands, specifically related to nitrogen reduction.

The Conservation Station trailer, developed by Iowa Learning Farms, will show

visitors what saturated buffers and bioreactors look like and how they function.

"The display will allow people to see components of water quality improvement practices that are often underground and not visible to the human eye," Stefanik says. "There will be educational opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds, and information on what they can do to help improve water quality."

Catherine DeLong, water quality program manager for Extension, says visitors

can also pick up a brochure on the Private Well Stewardship Program, a new initiative to help Iowans who depend on drinking water from their private wells.

In Iowa, about 7% of the population relies on private wells as their main water source. A well owner must ensure the drinking water is safe, but many Iowans are unsure how to maintain the quality.


The program offers information on testing, maintenance and funding resources to maintain well water quality.

Craft Beer Tent, the supplier of adult beverages for Syngenta Square.


"For example, we'll have Farmer Brown's multigrain ale, which has a great name," he notes. "We'll also have some familiar brands like Busch Light."
